## The Collaborative Team

The team makes a commitment to help spouses achieve a peaceful resolution to their divorce and to avoid the stress, expense, conflict and the unpredictability associated with traditional court litigation.

## The Collaborative Lawyer

An attorney who has been collaboratively trained or has successfully completed a collaborative divorce case. Each party retains their own collaborative lawyer to advise and educate them:

- on all family law issues that need to be addressed in their divorce such as Shared Parental Responsibility, Time-sharing, Equitable Distribution, Alimony and Child Support,
- on the terms to include in the legally binding marital settlement agreement which will be filed with the court and dictate all the terms of the final divorce, and
- draft and file the petition, the final judgment and all documents necessary to obtain a divorce under Florida Law.

## **The Neutral Facilitator**

A licensed mental health professional trained in the collaborative process to help the spouses:

- identify their individual goals and interests and manage the emotions associated with divorce,
- > lead the team meetings and encourage productive, goal oriented communications.
- create a parenting plan that addresses the unique needs of the children and parents and addresses the future restructuring of future family relationships.

## **The Neutral Forensic Financial**

A Certified Public Accountant, trained in the collaborative process to help the parties:

- identify the marital assets and liabilities to be equitably distributed and identify and separate any non-marital components,
- identify incomes, share financial information and draft each parties sworn financial affidavit; all statutory requirements in every divorce case,
- > analyze viable financial options for support and future cash flow and
- > trace accounts, identify tax issues, value a business or calculate child support.

Depending on the contents of the marital estate, the spouses may need other collaboratively trained specialists to assist them in finalizing their agreement such as a real estate appraiser or a realtor, a vocational coach to help a spouse transition into the work force, a financial planner or specialist to draft a Qualified Domestic Relation Order for the distribution of a pension or 401k.
